## JPJMS School Community Council Meeting Minutes

March 13, 2018

Call to Order and Welcome by Shanna Anderson at 4:30 p.m.

1. **Minutes from previous meeting (January 9) approved via email.** There are 14 voting members of the council and all 14 approved the minutes via email.
2. **Celebrations and Latest News**
  - a. Bryan Leggat mentioned that Concert Choir received superior ratings on all their competitions. He also mentioned that Ms. Rollins, the choir teacher will be moving to Kentucky this summer.
  - b. Mr. Leggat also celebrated the Literacy Night. It was well organized, and very successful. There were about 198 people in attendance, the student leaders were involved, every middle school students went home with a book, and it was good to have Mayor Riding in attendance. Comments were made from some students that this was the first book they've ever received.
3. **Counseling Report.** Erin Brown introduced herself. She is a new counselor over students whose last names start with N-Z. She mentioned that the counselors have finished their PCCR's. She

mentioned that the school is in the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of College Week and explained the different activities students will be involved in this week. Counselors are currently entering into the computers student course selections for next year. Erin mentioned that information on summer classes will be coming out around late April or early May.

**4. Principal's Report:**

- a. **Sage Testing.** Bryan Leggat mentioned that SAGE testing can be pushed to later in the school year so that teachers can have more instruction time. SAGE testing will be starting April 9<sup>th</sup>. He mentioned that there is a lot of pressure placed on teachers who give SAGE test. He also mentioned some challenges are that we still have new teachers, many students are apathetic, and many students get frustrated easily. He said that teachers this year can have a final test. One incentive to do well on the SAGE is that if the student gets a "3" or "4" on the SAGE they will not have to take the final test. Some ideas offered by the council included sending a letter to parents on the benefits of taking the SAGE test, and also asking parents who opt out their students their reasons (data collection only).
  - b. **Keyboarding/Digital Literacy.** Patrice Shaffer was asked to explain the changes with the Keyboarding and Digital Literacy classes next year. She explained that starting next year will be required of students to take the Digital Literacy class. We will have it required of all 7<sup>th</sup> graders and those who can't fit it in their schedules will be taking it in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. The school will no longer be offering Keyboarding as a separate class, but will put it as part of the Digital Literacy class. Digital Literacy takes the place of the Computer Technology class, and has been offered in earlier grades so that students can sooner benefit from the skills learned in the class.
  - c. **Literacy Night recap** was given by Bryan Leggat during Celebration section.
  - d. **Walk Out.** Bryan Leggat explained how the school will handle the national walk out to be held tomorrow at 10:00 am.
5. **Discussion.** Bryan Leggat explained changes made to the State Trust Land Plan he presented at the meeting in January. Some of the changes included decreasing the amount for Professional Development and moving it to purchasing Chromebook mobile labs. Purchasing 5 Chromebook mobile labs instead of 4. Increasing the amount for substitute pay. The ending amount will still total \$85,100.
6. **Adopting next STL plan for 2018-2019: Plan will be written once items adopted and be distributed for final verification via email.** Council members wrote their email addresses on the roll so that the final verification email will be sent to the correct person. Bryan Leggat mentioned that council members should start checking their email as early as tomorrow for the final verification email.
7. **Crossing Guards for next year.** It was mentioned that there will be crossing guards next year, so it will not be necessary for people to attend the April 11<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting.

8. **Reunification Plan.** Aaron Hunter handed out copies of the school's Reunification Plan and explained the procedures. Discussion was held and a suggestion was given to have an approach sign. The next question is how to get the information out to parents.
