1. **Welcome:** by Shanna Anderson
2. **Minutes from previous meeting (November 13) approved via email.** There are 14 voting members of the Community Council. All 14 approved the minutes.
3. **Celebrations and Latest News** by Bryan Leggat.
 - a. Had a successful Panther Express activity where gathered donations for the Children's Justice Center. There were two truckloads of donations, and the Children's Justice Center was amazed and grateful.
 - b. The Fine Arts Assemblies went well.
 - c. Elisha Johnson was named Health Teacher of the Month for the State of Utah.
 - d. Reality Town went really well and received a lot of positive feedback from the students. There were plenty of volunteers which really helped.
 - e. ELL students at Joel P. Jensen showed most progress from year to year in the district thanks to the students' hard work and Ms. Halverson's encouragement.

- f. The school had an 89.5% passing rate for 1st quarter.
4. **Counseling** report given by Derek Winder.
 - a. The counselors have started the 8th Grade PCCR's this week. They will go until mid-February. Parents expressed appreciation for having evening appointments.
 - b. Started working on course selection for next year. Will be going to the feeder schools in February, and will start course selection at the end of February. This will be done through the Math classes. Registration for high school will be March 7th and will be conducted through the Geography classes. There will not be arena scheduling for high school this year.
 - c. Will be doing a college tour to the University of Utah during College Week. The details are still being worked out.
 - d. **School Senate** report. Ms. Johnson wanted everyone to know about the successful Panther Express activity and how grateful the Children's Justice Center was for the donations. Spirit Week will be the week of January 22nd. An assembly will be held on January 24th.
 5. **Principal's Report** by Bryan Leggat.
 - a. **Boundary Changes.** Mr. Leggat explained what has been happening with the boundary changes and the current status. In the end, Joel P. Jensen ended up with fewer students. A handout was given showing the new boundaries.
 - b. **Permits.** Because of our smaller size, we will be accepting everyone on permit. Please let everyone know they are welcome at Joel P. Jensen Middle School. Amber Zdunich shared some permit numbers. She said that besides the existing permits, there are currently 58 new permits. Next year's school size might be the same as this year.
 - c. **Other Related Changes for next year.** We are pushing to have the ALPS program at our school next year. Final decisions have not been made.
 6. **SNAP-Plan Review and Approval.** Aaron Hunter reviewed the boundaries and walking areas. There will not need to be changes made to the SNAP-Plan for next year. He will send out links for approval.
 7. **Report: Current STL plan status and progress.** Bryan Leggat presented a slideshow explaining last year's plan and where it stands.
 8. **Discussion: Ideas for next STL plan.** Bryan explained five categories of need and proposed goals in Literacy, Numeracy, Academic Success, Technology, and Professional Development. He explained programs that are currently in place and would need continued funding as well as new ideas to include in this year's plan. Some of the new ideas discussed were a math skills program that would focus on math facts, a Catch-Up Lunch aide, and three mobile labs (Spanish, Social Studies and Fine Arts). Suggestions were given to gather numbers involving the use of the Ascend Math Program during RTI to measure the effectiveness. It was also suggested to talk with other schools to see what math program they are using to help struggling math students. The council would like to find a math program that will be as successful in helping students in math as the Reading+ helps students with reading. Mr. Leggat will forward information to Shanna Anderson as it becomes available, and she will send it out to the rest of the council.
