ZAP! VISION

Create a school climate which fosters academic success through mastery of standards.



WHAT IS ZAP!?

- Lunchtime intervention program developed to assist students in achieving proficiency of content in their classes.
- Holds students accountable for learning essential material so they can reach proficiency.




BACKGROUND

- The ZAP! program was designed as an intervention to support students who are not demonstrating proficiency, or understanding, of content.
- Students who are missing work or struggling with proficiency will be required to attend a ZAP! session during their lunch period.
- If a student does not attend a session or refuses to make up an assignment, further consequences will apply.

GOAL

The goal of this ZAP! intervention is to prevent students from failing because of they haven't mastered content in their classes.




ZAP! PROCEDURES

Process of ZAP!:

- The ZAP! program will be implemented by many of your teachers.
- All teachers can ZAP! their students.
- A ZAP! assignment is given when students struggle with proficiency.
- Said student is “zapped” and is then required to go to the ZAP! room to complete an assignment or assessment during lunch.

MANAGEMENT


Management of ZAP! will include the following:

- Parent
 - Students
 - Teachers
 - Administration
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ZAP! PROCEDURES (Cont...)

- The teacher informs the student that he/she has been zapped.
- The teacher will have the assessment or assignment delivered to the ZAP! room.
- Students may or may not receive a reminder ticket the period before lunch. It is your responsibility to show up for ZAP!
- If you have ZAP!, find an administrator in the cafeteria.

ZAP! PROCEDURES (Cont...)

- When you are done with your ZAP! assignment/assessment, hand it to the ZAP! Aide (the aide will then hand it in to the teacher).
 - Never hand a ZAP! assignment /assessment in to your teacher!
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POSITIVES

- Helps students develop proficiency in their classes.
- Helps students develop good habits and allows them to be successful.
- Allows students to bring up their grades and participate in your choice activities during RTI.

WHAT IF?....

Question: What if a student gets ZAPPED and already has a lunch detention?

Answer: ZAP! takes priority over lunch detention. Students will complete ZAP! and the lunch detention will carry over to the next day.
